



QWCHC Rules and Regulations

Competitor's/participants at any event run by QWCHC have a responsibility to ensure the welfare of their horses and at all times to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect and compassion.

Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the Affiliate and other competitors. To uphold the rules and regulations of the QWCHC at all times. Competitors/participants are to demonstrate good sportsmanship at all times, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated. The QWCHC trusts and respects our members to exercise responsibility whenever they participate in social media. Any breaches of the QWCHC social media code of conduct will attract disciplinary action.

Camping on the Caboolture Show Society grounds will attract a \$22/night fee payable on the day. Stables are available for a \$22/day fee payable on the day. Day yards are available to use free of charge.

Horse Health Declarations and a movement record must be filled out and presented at the secretary's office on the day prior to start of event. Any sick or injured horses must be reported to the QWCHC committee immediately. Any horse showing signs of sickness within two (2) weeks of competing at a QWCHC event must be reported to the QWCHC committee.

The cattle pavilion is deemed a horse free zone, with the area between the cattle pavilion, secretaries office and arena a designated pedestrian zone. There are to be NO horses in these areas at any time.

All dogs on the grounds must be secured by a lead and under control at all times. No dogs are allowed in the grandstand area or horse zones.

All manure & hay must be cleaned up and placed at designated manure sites/bins on the Caboolture Show Grounds. All sites left unclean will be charged a cleaning fee of \$80 by the Caboolture Show Society. Any stables left uncleaned will be charged a cleaning fee of \$40 per stable by Caboolture Show Society.

Complaints against competitor's / members will only be accepted in writing and signed by the complainant on each page or a letter of complaint from a judge

If action against the competitor / member is warranted the committee will write, informing the competitor / member of whom the complaint has been made against, advising him/her the date and time the committee will be resolving the issue, thus giving that competitor / member the opportunity to state his / her reason / explanation to the committee

The committee may resolve complaints in the following manner

- Warning letter,**
- Suspension of three club days,**
- Cancellation of membership, or any combinations.**
